

MA Clinical Education



The interprofessional MA Clinical Education addresses the contemporary context, educational theory and practical teaching skills relevant to practitioners involved in education and training in the clinical environment. It has been developed by the London Deanery in collaboration with the Institute of Education.

The MA Clinical Education will enable you to:

- critically appraise, design and develop your clinical educational practice
- relate your professional concerns to debates within clinical education
- identify new questions about clinical education, its context and development
- write academic essays and conduct research
- study independently and as a member of a community of learners.

The course comprises three core modules, an extended piece of written work and optional modules up to a total of 180 credits. It is available as a full-time (one year) or part-time (two to four year) course.

All three core modules are available as stand-alone short courses. If you would like to progress from a short course on to the MA programme, you can do so by undertaking the module assessment.
